## Spotlight on:

### PAWNEE CITY HISTORICAL SOCIETY/MUSEUM

Have you ever seen the Pawnee City business quilt from the 1890's? Over 800 types of barbed wire? A log cabin discovered when a farmhouse was torn down? Antique farm implements? A one room schoolhouse? A wood burning cook stove?

See these and thousands of other items displayed in the 22 buildings that are the Pawnee City Historical Museum, located on the east edge of town. The Museum is entirely supported by donations and managed by a volunteer board of directors. It is open mid-April to mid-October, with many volunteers staffing the office and giving tours.

Other volunteers help with cleaning and maintenance, do special projects, and help with special events. The special events include the annual Historical Days on the fourth weekend of September, frequently featuring a Civil War re-enactment. Other events vary from year to year.
