Pawnee City Library Foundation

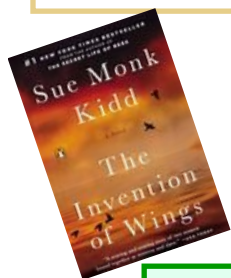
